

Why did TVE choose Sociocracy?

INITIALLY:

- All cohousing communities require a system of self-governance
- Recommended by cohousing consultant: Jasen Robillard
- Heard that people were switching to Sociocracy from consensus
- Resources were clearer than those relating to consensus governance
- Off the shelf training and consultancy service from SoFA
- Had to think quickly!

Why was TVE happy it chose Sociocracy?

AFTER A WHILE:

- Relatively quick decision processes zone of tolerance for consent 'Safe enough to try, good enough for now'
- Quasi-autonomous decision making in small groups and sharing in rounds allows more people to make meaningful contributions and invites shared decision making across membership
- Ongoing evaluations ensuring effectiveness of processes and performance

'Sociocracy provides structure, principles, and planning for living harmoniously and joyfully. It offers a compelling model for connecting and empowering people, along with giving them the tools to collaborate, which is one of many reasons why we've adopted sociocracy.' TVE EXPLORERS CHECKLIST

Challenges specific to cohousing

- Member turnover community in development: risk, commitment, investment
- Members having different levels of knowledge means newer people are less likely to consent to roles
- Decisions that can't be 'good enough for now'

Challenges specific to TVE

- Aggressive timeline people need to learn Sociocracy fast
- Capacity of members families
- Uniqueness of the project Eastern Canada
- Members from across 8 time zones

Challenges specific to Sociocracy

- Very different from people's previous experiences of meetings
- You can't learn Sociocracy by osmosis: values, knowledge, skills
- Time given over to 'housekeeping' reviews, evaluations
- Many Voices One Song (though works well for some members)
- How much can you change?

r If I could do everything again I would...

- Never assume that your past experience prepares you for Sociocracy.
- Don't have one expert on Sociocracy in the community.
- Start the Learning Circle to think strategically about learning needs sooner.

- Never underestimate the usefulness of a simple Cheat Sheet.
- Ask for help sooner.
- Offer help sooner.


- Educate one small group at a time, don't do mass learning.
- Don't buy the MVOS ebook you can write notes in the hard copy.
- Devise a system to store the learning links earlier.

- Don't spend time in your Empowered Learning Circle trying to name yourselves.
- Don't underestimate your own knowledge of Sociocracy.
- Depart from Sociocracy with care but understand it may be necessary at times to bend the rules.
