




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
What is consent?

Top-down hierarchy




proposal hierarchy decision





objection


I think, this proposal **negatively impacts** how well we can reach our aim.

"I don't consent."

=

"I have an objection."

Consent process



Demo: running a cafe

Cafe aim: running a café with healthy breakfast, snacks and hot drinks. **Infrastructure and Maintenance Circle aim:** providing and maintaining the built environment of the café

Proposal:

Increase the number of tables from 20 to 24 (and the number of chairs from 40 to 48).

Exercise: populating Mars



- **Organization aim:** populating Mars, with 120 people.
- **Circle aim:** Entertaining the travelers during the 9 month flight to keep peace, health and increase connection and confidence in the project.
- Proposal: The circle is putting on a mandatory Soccer Mars Cup for everyone older than 11 years old.
